Water for World Peace

As the world discusses water wars, we focus our intention on a direct experience of water for peace.

- What is the role of water in fostering world peace?
- What's the relationship between water, traditional spirituality, and the modern world?
- What are natural water cycles?

Together, through pilgrimage, conversation, and visits to pioneering community catchment water projects, we explore these themes.

Holy Island was home to St. Cuthbert (634-687). Legend has it, through prayer, he drew a spring of water from a stony rock when it was needed on the island. We begin our walk here, and end at the Belford Catchment Solutions project which has transformed an area prone to flooding to a more secure and ecologically sound region.

Floods and droughts are two sides of the same coin. The measures taken in Belford to ease floods are similar to those taken by Rajendra Singh in India to relieve droughts by Rajendra Singh, where he has revived seven rivers.

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
